# **Career & Experience**

01/1967-04/1971

Embarked on a surveying career as a Survey Assistant in Lands and Surveys Dept. Sabah Government under the supervision of Mr. Arthur H. Kinkade, a New Zealand surveyor, in carrying out cadastral survey, photogrammetric control survey and geodetic survey. Obtained a scholarship to attend a Diploma Course in Land Surveying Science in Technical College. KL.

04/1971-1972

After graduation I returned to Lands and Surveys Dept. Sabah to work as an Assistant District Surveyor in Tawau, Sabah assisting District Surveyor, Mr. Henry H L Kong, an Australian trained surveyor, in supervising field survey parties and their work including field inspections; carrying out cadastral surveys, vetting and commenting on subdivision plans; checking survey field observations, field books and survey plans submitted by Licensed Surveyors; charting survey lots onto standard sheets and documentation. I also assisted Sabah State Town Planner Mr. John Barret, on Town and Country Planning matters. Mr. John Barret is presently the President of New Zealand Institute of Surveyors Hong Kong Branch.

In November 1972 I met Mr. Arthur H. Kinkade again in Hong Kong and through him I was granted an interview with Mr. Kieth B. Gordon, a New Zealand Land Surveyor working in Maunsell Consultant Asia Ltd. I was offered a post of **Survey Officer** (**Engineering**) in Route 4 (Lung Cheung Road) Projects carrying out survey check on setting out by the contractors in civil engineering works, establishing geodetic control traverses to maintain consistency and accuracy in the works and adjacent or future works. I enjoyed my works and had good working relation with Engineers and Inspectors. It was a good teamwork.

From September 1976 I furthered my study in the University of East London (formerly known as North East London Polytechnic) and by July 1979 earned my B. Sc. (Hons) Degree in Land surveying Sciences.

07/1979

I returned to Hong Kong and worked in Gammon Leighton Joint Venture in Discovery Bay Development as a site surveyor.

01/1980-04/1981

I rejoined Maunsell Consultant Asia Ltd in Tai Po/Fanling New Town assisting Mr. lan Smith, a New Zealand surveyor who now works in Auckland.

1981-1982

**First Surveyor** with China Light and Power Co., Ltd. carrying out profiling survey for transmission lines and topographic survey, setting out and boundary survey of substations.

1982-1985

Chief Technical Officer held against Land Surveyor post with Maunsell Consultants Asia Ltd. on Shatin and Ma On Shan New Town Development. I earned my RICS in November 1984 and in 1985 I was later promoted to Resident Land Surveyor.

1985-1993

**Resident Land Surveyor** with Maunsell Consultants Asia Ltd. H.K.Projects: Shatin and Ma On Shan, Tai Po, Fanling and Tsung Kwan O New Town Development working with 250 site staff. During my tenure in New Town Development projects I was responsible for the planning and supervision of surveying staff providing surveying and technical services to the development. These include carrying out record survey, marine survey for large reclamation, production of maps, establishment of rigorous geodetic control survey for the setting out and checking of dual lane carriageway with slip roads, grade-separated interchanges, underpasses, flyovers and elevated super-structures, bore piling works, subways, trunk sewers, box culverts, seawalls and geotechnical works, site measurement and computation of large earthwork quantity. Apart from supervising the works and provide training for the SO(Eng.) I was responsible for the day to day administration and operation of TO (Civil) in the documentation, registration and up-dating drawings and the preparation of as-built drawings. My responsibility and duty also extended to the planning, feasibility study, introduction, implementation and supervision of the computer assisted plotting facility, the Intergraph Surveying System, which catered for computing all earthwork measurement and all survey plotting and the production of initial, monthly interim and final record survey maps inclusive of cross-sections.

1993 - 1996

Airport Core Program Projects: West Kowloon Expressways N & S Sections (contract sum was HKD2500 millions) with Maunsell as Resident Senior Land Surveyor. Assisted by a Resident Land Surveyor, four SSO (Eng.) and four SO (Eng.) and seven TO (Civil); and working with a team 80 Resident Site Staff consisting of expatriates and local Professional Engineers, Quantity Surveyors, Senior Inspectors and other site staff, I was charged with the responsibility and duty of ensuring that every work was correctly and properly positioned, constructed and installed to the designed lines and levels. These include grade-separated interchanges, grade-separated MTRC tunnels, slip roads, underpasses, 21 cast-in-situ and balanced cantilever (segmental) construction of complex elevated super-structural carriageway and other associated civil works.

1996-2001

Central Wan Chai Trunk Sewers with Maunsell working as a Resident Land Surveyor on the 5.3km long and -13m deep trenchless 2.5m diameter trunk sewer pipe line originating from Kennedy Town and extending through and underneath Connaught Road to reach the new Pumping Station at Wan Chai. The tunneling works went through and underneath some of the busiest roads and the most expansive high rise office, commercial and hotel buildings in Central. Also it had to avoid and clear of all the underground utilities. This 5.3km long and 2.5m diameter trunk sewer connects to two large pumping stations with secant bore pile wall support. The wall of each pumping station is supported by about 90 numbers of secant bore piles each with an average depth of 40m.

2001-present

**T7 Trunk Road in Ma On Shan with Maunsell working as a Senior Resident Land Surveyor** on a HKD1360 million project of 3.5 km trunk road consisting of 6 bridges, two viaducts three footbridges, two curved tunnels passing through bedrock, extensive earthworks and a good network of drainages and retaining walls etc. The project starts from Hang On Estate and extends along the foothill of Ma On Shan to Symphony Bay. The coordination and liaison within the group of engineers, surveyors and inspectors of works demand not only expert technical know how but also good human skill and relationship. This is very much teamwork. A Reference GPS station and four RTK GPS units together with the latest surveying instrumentations for tunneling are used for the control surveying as well as setting out survey in this project.
